KIDMAN TRAIL Kapunda

The Kidman Trail provides a range of horse riding, cycling and walking experiences. The route links McLaren Vale and Fleurieu regions to Kapunda through the Adelaide Hills and Barossa Valley.

The trail is named after Sir Sidney Kidman, a prominent pastoralist and horse breeder. The trail utilises forest tracks, roadways and unmade road reserves.

CODE OF PRACTICE

- Plan your trail experience.
- Comply with signage.
- Stay on the formed, designated trails - this protects native vegetation, animals, farm animals and crops.
- Respect the rights of others.
- Respect cultural heritage.
- Keep watercourses pollution free.
- Leave pets at home.
- Share the trail.
- Leave nothing behind. Take all rubbish, excess horse feed and manure home with you.
- Clean your boots, bikes or hooves to avoid spreading plant diseases or weeds.






TRAVELLING ON THE KIDMAN TRAIL

- Permits are required for horse riding on ForestrySA land.
- Respect private landholders. It is illegal for private land to be accessed by people, horses or dogs for any purpose including stock water or shelter.
- Respect farming livestock. Do not approach. Move past wide and slow.
- Book ahead for all accommodation, including ForestrySA campsites. • Horses need to be able to tolerate traffic at close proximity.
- Report fallen trees, hazards or other maintenance issues to Horse SA.
- Expect water levels at ford crossings and creeks to vary in depth.





- The Kidman Trail is closed on ForestrySA Land on Total Fire Ban days call the Country Fire Service hotline for information.
- Users of this trail do so at their own risk.
- Horse riding, cycling and walking all involve risks and should be undertaken with care and regard for other trail and road users and the environment at all times.
- The trail is subject to natural forces, varying weather and track conditions.
- It is recommended that horse riders and cyclists wear an Australian Standards approved helmet.
- All trail users should wear high visibility clothing.










