### LYNDOCH ROAD SEALING

Light Regional Council is pleased to announce that it will receive \$900,000 in funding through the Australian Government's Special Local Roads Program to seal the remaining portion of Lyndoch Road. This \$1.65m project would not have been possible without the support of local member, the Hon Stephan Knoll MP (Member for Schubert) and the South Australian Government that contributed \$500,000 towards the works. This funding will be used to:

- Construct and seal approximately 4.5km of road;
- Realign the junction of Lyndoch Road and Hentschke Road; and
- Provide protection to hazards such as steep embankments or culvert crossings across the road.

In regard to the announcement of the funding for these works Council's Mayor Bill O'Brien stated *"Lyndoch Road is an extremely important link between the southern Barossa and the iconic Seppeltsfield area. The existing road is struggling to cope with the volume of traffic that is using it and this funding will enable a high standard road to be constructed that will not only improve the safety for all road users but significantly improve the amenity for the businesses and residents that rely on this road to perform on a daily basis."*

Council is planning to commence construction in the next few weeks with all works targeted for completion by the end of 2019.
